January 10 - *Wings of Life* (81 min): Narrated by Meryl Streep, this intimate and unprecedented look at butterflies, hummingbirds, bees, bats and flowers is a celebration of life, as a third of the world's food supply depends on these incredible – and increasingly threatened – creatures.

January 24 - *Tapped* (76 min): Is access to clean water a basic human right or a commodity that should be bought and sold? From plastic production to the ocean in which so many of these bottles end up, this inspiring documentary trails the path of the bottled water industry and the communities which were the unwitting chips on the table.

February 7 - *From the Ashes* (82 min): *From the Ashes* captures Americans in communities across the country as they wrestle with the legacy of the coal industry and what its future should be under the Trump Administration. From Appalachia to the West's Powder River Basin, the film goes beyond the rhetoric of the "war on coal" to present compelling and often heartbreaking stories about what's at stake for our economy, health and climate.

February 21 - *Chasing Coral* (93 min): Coral reefs around the world are vanishing at an unprecedented rate. A team of divers, photographers and scientists set out on a thrilling ocean adventure to discover why and to reveal the underwater mystery to the world.

March 7 - *Forgotten Coast* (55 min): Following in the footsteps of a wandering Florida black bear, three friends leave civilization and enter a lost American wilderness on a rugged thousand-mile journey by foot, paddle and bike. Traversing Florida's vast and seldom seen "Forgotten Coast," the expedition encounters stunning and rare wildlife in a fragile corridor stretching from the Everglades to the Florida-Alabama border.

March 21 - *Mission Blue* (96 min): This documentary follows legendary oceanographer, marine biologist, environmentalist and National Geographic Explorer-in-Residence Sylvia Earle and her campaign to create a global network of protected marine sanctuaries.

April 4 - *STRAWS* (32 min): *STRAWS* is a short documentary about the negative impact of plastic straw litter on marine life and how we can effect a sea of change...one straw at a time.
